The Top 10 Behavior Management and Instructional Strategies That All Teachers Should Use

On June 8, 2012 a large audience of special educators and teachers across all levels and disciplines, teacher educators, administrators and preservice educators attended the 2nd Annual Summer Institute sponsored by ILCCBD and Illinois State University. Those who attended had the good fortune to hear Dr. Brenda Scheuermann, Illinois native and distinguished professional in the field of emotional and behavioral disorders (EBD).

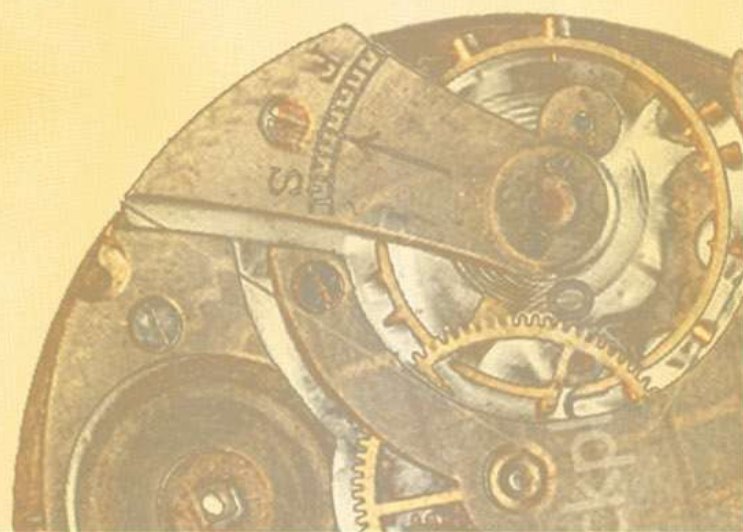
What made it to Dr. Scheuermann's top ten behavior management and instructional strategies? First, for three hours, the audience listened to top notch information and example after example of reasons for creating clarity and predictability in classrooms for students with EBD. The speaker made it clear that we need to be thinking about the contribution of antecedents and how we can use them to work with the students we teach.

Dr. Scheuermann illustrated very clearly that we need to provide dynamic, relevant, and engaging instruction, while providing choices and incorporating student interests. She discussed the use of easier tasks in the context of more challenging tasks and using behavioral momentum to bring about positive behaviors. She reaffirmed the role of models while providing interspersed examples of both social and academic tasks. Finally, monitoring verbal interactions, consideration of student motivation and the use of more positive reinforcement made it to the top ten list.

In conclusion Dr. Brenda Scheuermann inspired the attendees to take on the tougher, and potentially exciting professional challenges they face with the perspective of a teacher-researcher. Such a perspective encourages professionals in the field of EBD to face very real problems with a data based perspective. Such professionals face the tough questions of their day-to-day clinical work with hypotheses based on theory and knowledge of effective and potentially effective interventions. This perspective encourages Dr. Scheuermann, “allows you to make informed decisions about effectiveness of interventions.” Additionally she encourages that this perspective is “excellent for communicating with parents, team members and demonstrates professionalism.”

In closing, thank you to all who attended this memorable event and we look forward to hearing success stories during the year based the information shared during the ILCCBD/ISU Summer Institute, 2012.

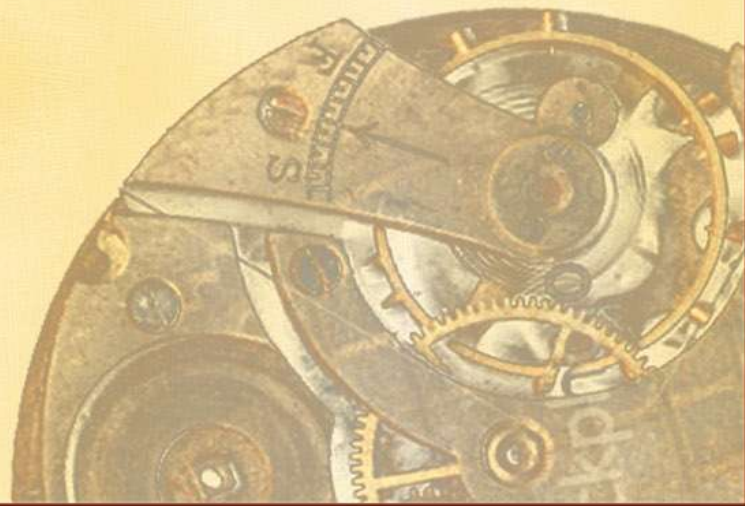

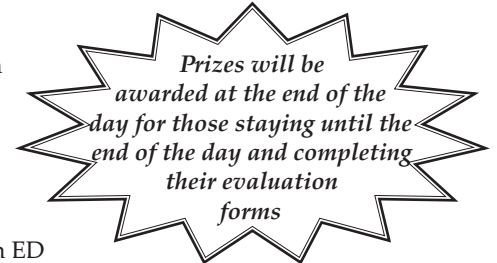
